## War Measures Pct

- 100 mile protection zone
- Japanese Canadians must report to Hastings Park
- War ended: exile to Japan or move east of the Rockies
- 1948 right to vote
- 1949 the last bill restricting movement is rescinded



## HastingS Pak

- 8000 Japanese Canadians were interned at Hastings Park
- "Housed" in exhibition buildings and livestock stables

- Men separated from women and children
- Temporary stay on the way to more permanent settlements
- One suitcase per person



## IncarceationNInternment Camps in B.C. Inteior

- Ghost towns, farms, parks
- Harsh winters, unprepared
- Built own shelters
- Paid for own imprisonment from forced sale of businesses and homes
